AIR CONDITIONING

Change filters monthly and make sure they are installed facing the correct direction. Service your system annually for maximum efficiency.

REFRIGERATION

Maximize efficiency by setting the temperature at or near the manufacture's optimal settings. Vacuum dust from condenser coils on the rear or bottom of unit, and prevent cold air leakage by replacing damaged door seals.

How to calculate cost per hour

To calculate the approximate cost to operate a specific appliance or other item not included on this brochure, locate the wattage listed on the appliance (you may need to reference the owner's manual) and divide it by 1,000 to get the kWh. Once you have the kWh, multiply by \$0.122 cents per kWh to get an approximate cost to operate the appliance for one hour.

For example: Consider an appliance that uses 600 Watts. Divide 600 Watts by 1,000 = .6 kWh.

Multiply .6 kWh by \$0.122 cents per kWh = **\$0.0732 per hour.**
